THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW PART 2 BIBLE STUDY BY JAMIE MCNAB 8/8/15

John The Baptist preached about Repentance and he preached about the wrath to come.

A good way to defeat satan would be to use God's Word.

Remember: This Gospel is more addressed to the Jews ... using the terms along the lines of ... "that it might be fulfilled".

Matthew 4:12-17

Now when Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, He departed to Galilee. And leaving Nazareth, He came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the regions of Zebulun and Naphtali, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying:

"The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali,

By the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles:

The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, And upon those who sat in the region and shadow of death Light has dawned."

From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

REPENT!! Change the way you are living!

Again and again and again ... Matthew speaks about "the Kingdom of Heaven".

<u>Matthew 4:18-22</u>

And Jesus, walking by the Sea of Galilee, saw two brothers, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were

fishermen. Then He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." They immediately left their nets and followed Him.

Going on from there, He saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets. He called them, and immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed Him.

These 4 men already knew Jesus. The verses below occur just one day after Jesus was baptised ... His first public appearance.

John 1:35-42

Again, the next day, <u>John stood with two of his disciples</u>. And looking at Jesus as He walked, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God!"

The two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them, "What do you seek?" They said to Him, "Rabbi" (which is to say, when translated, Teacher), "where are You staying?"

He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where He was staying, and remained with Him that day (now it was about the tenth hour).

One of the two who heard John speak, and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his own brother Simon, and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated, the Christ). And he brought him to Jesus.

Now when Jesus looked at him, He said, "You are Simon the son of Jonah. You shall be called Cephas" (which is translated, A Stone).

John 1:45

Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

Matthew 4:23-25

And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people. Then His fame went

throughout all Syria; and they brought to Him all sick people who were afflicted with various diseases and torments, and those who were demonpossessed, epileptics, and paralytics; and He healed them. Great multitudes followed Him—from Galilee, and from Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea, and beyond the Jordan.

Jesus had a 3 part ministry:

Jesus taught in the synagogues Jesus preached everywhere

Jesus healed ALL ... everything ... and everybody. See the following verses:

Matthew 9:35

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, <u>teaching in their</u> <u>synagogues</u>, <u>preaching the gospel of the kingdom</u>, and <u>healing every</u> <u>sickness and every disease</u> among the people.

Matthew 12:15

But when Jesus knew it, He withdrew from there. And great multitudes followed Him, and **He healed them all**.

Matthew 14:14

And when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and <u>healed their sick</u>.

Matthew 14:34-36

When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret. And when the men of that place recognised Him, they sent out into all that surrounding region, brought to Him all who were sick, and begged Him that they might only touch the hem of His garment. And <u>as many as touched</u> it were made perfectly well.

Jesus preached 5 sermons: Matthew chapters 5, 6 and 7 covers 1 of those sermons ... chapters 10, 13, 18, 24–25 each cover one sermon.

Matthew 5:1-12

And seeing the multitudes, He went up on a mountain, and when He was seated His disciples came to Him. Then He opened His mouth and taught them, saying:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, (humble)

For theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, (over sin)

For they shall be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, (meek ... not week ... yielded to God)

For they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, (have a passion, a zeal ... to be more righteous)

For they shall be filled.

Blessed are the merciful,

For they shall obtain mercy. (mercy is not minimising peoples sins)

Blessed are the pure in heart, (unmixed with the world)

For they shall see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers,

For they shall be called sons of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake,

For theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

"Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake. Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Matthew 5:13-16

"You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavour, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men.

"You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works (people should SEE our good works) and glorify your Father in heaven.

Matthew 5:17-20

"Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. (Jesus did not come to do away with the law ... He came to fulfill it) For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled. Whoever therefore breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I say to you, (I ... Jesus say to you) that unless your righteousness exceeds the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 5:21-26

"You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be in danger of the judgment.' But I say to you that whoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment. And whoever says to his brother, 'Raca!' shall be in danger of the council. But whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be in danger of hell fire.

Therefore if you bring your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar, and go your way. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Agree with your adversary quickly, while you are on the way with him, lest your adversary deliver you to the judge, the judge hand you over to the officer, and you be thrown into prison. Assuredly, <u>I</u> say to you, you will by no means get out of there till you have paid the last penny.

Matthew 5:27-30

"You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be <u>cast into hell</u>. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your

members perish, than for your whole body to be <u>cast into hell.</u> (<u>Gehenna</u> <u>fire</u>)

Jesus mentions Gehenna 11 times and James once ... 12 times in total in the New Testament.

Matthew 5:31-32

"Furthermore it has been said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' (Greek: Apoluo "divorce" ... "Put away" no implication that you are legally free to re-marry) **But I say to you** that whoever divorces (puts away) his wife for any reason except (sexual immorality) porneia ... (fornication prior to marriage) causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery.

The School of Shammai ... you could only put away your wife for sexual immorality.

The School of Hillel ... had a different view. Very liberal ... for any reason at all! If the husband wasn't pleased ... that was the grounds for putting away.

Matthew 5:33-37

"Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform your oaths to the Lord.' But I say to you, do not swear at all: neither by heaven, for it is God's throne; nor by the earth, for it is His footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. Nor shall you swear by your head, because you cannot make one hair white or black. But let your "Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' For whatever is more than these is from the evil one.

Matthew 5:38-42

"You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' (they wanted to take revenge) But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. (an idiom ... don't retaliate ... don't seek to get equal ... remain generous in spirit) If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic,

let him have your cloak also. And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two. Give to him who asks you, and from him who wants to borrow from you do not turn away.

Compare:

Romans 12:17-21

Repay no one evil for evil. Have regard for good things in the sight of all men. If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men. Beloved, do not avenge yourselves, but rather give place to wrath; for it is written, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay," says the Lord. Therefore

"If your enemy is hungry, feed him;

If he is thirsty, give him a drink;

For in so doing you will heap coals of fire on his head."

Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. (don't succumb to the pressures in the world)

Don't let evil get the best of you:

Romans 12:21 The Voice

Never let evil get the best of you; instead, overpower evil with the good.

Matthew 5:43-48

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' (The rabbis added this to the scriptures) But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you, that you may be sons of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brethren only, what do you do more than others? Do not even the tax collectors do so? Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect.

Matthew 6:1-4

"Take heed that you do not do your <u>charitable deeds</u> (<u>righteousness</u>) before men, to be seen by them. Otherwise you have no reward from your Father in heaven. Therefore, <u>when you do a charitable deed</u>, do not sound a trumpet before you as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have glory from men. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. (<u>The Greek implies: Paid In Full</u>) But <u>when you do a charitable deed</u>, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, that your charitable deed may be in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will Himself reward you openly.

Why are you doing it to be seen? What is the motivation here? Do you want to do something that is honourable before God ... or just to impress people?

Matthew 6:5-8

"And when you pray, you shall not be like the hypocrites. For they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the corners of the streets, that they may be seen by men. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you pray, go into your room, and when you have shut your door, pray to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly. And when you pray, do not use vain repetitions as the heathen do. For they think that they will be heard for their many words. "Therefore do not be like them. For your Father knows the things you have need of before you ask Him. (But we should ask Him)

Matthew 6:9-15

In this manner, therefore, pray:

Our Father in heaven,

Hallowed be Your name.

Your kingdom come.

Your will be done

On earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread. (Indicating that we should pray daily)
And forgive us our debts,

As we forgive our debtors.

And do not lead us into temptation,

But deliver us from the evil one.

For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen. "For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

Matthew 6:16-18

"Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly.

Matthew 6:19-21

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, (we shouldn't be building up "our portfolios") where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Matthew 6:22-23

"The lamp of the body is the eye. If therefore your eye is good, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eye is bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in you is darkness, how great is that darkness!

Matthew 6:24

"No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. (So says Jesus!! You need to have your focus on God)

Matthew 6:25-34

"Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. (Where is your priority?) Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? Which of you by worrying can add one cubit to his stature?

"So why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; and yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. Now if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? (God is a "much more God")

"Therefore do not worry, (worry is a symbol of little faith) saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. (Choose God as your Master) But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. (PUT GOD FIRST!! RENEW YOUR MIND!! SEEK THE BIGGER PICTURE! God is in the business of adding and multiplying!!) Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.
