FEAST OF TABERNACLES SECOND DAY ... NEARLY ... BUT NOT QUITE ... PERFECT UTOPIA JAMIE MCNAB 18.10.16

We are picturing the World To Come. It will be very different to today.

Satan will be gone! This world's civilisation ended ... no more politics ... dictators ... oppression corruption. At last an opportunity for the whole world to live in peace and prosperity.

Isaiah 2:2-4 (NKJV) 2 Now it shall come to pass in the latter days That the mountain of the Lord's house Shall be established on the top of the mountains. And shall be exalted above the hills: And all nations shall flow to it. 3 Many people shall come and say, "Come, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, To the house of the God of Jacob; He will teach us His ways, And we shall walk in His paths." For out of Zion shall go forth the law, And the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. 4 He shall judge between the nations, And rebuke many people; They shall beat their swords into plowshares. And their spears into pruning hooks; Nation shall not lift up sword against nation, Neither shall they learn war anymore.

People will be keen to learn God's ways. They will not learn war again.

<u>Psalms 72:3-7 (NKJV)</u>

3 The mountains will bring peace to the people,And the little hills, by righteousness.4 He will bring justice to the poor of the people;

He will save the children of the needy,

And will break in pieces the oppressor.

5 They shall fear You

As long as the sun and moon endure,

Throughout all generations.

6 He shall come down like rain upon the grass before mowing, Like showers that water the earth.

7 <u>In His days the righteous shall flourish,</u> <u>And abundance of peace,</u> Until the moon is no more.

<u>Psalms 72:11-17 (NKJV)</u>

11 Yes, all kings shall fall down before Him; All nations shall serve Him. 12 For He will deliver the needy when he cries, The poor also, and him who has no helper. 13 He will spare the poor and needy, And will save the souls of the needy. 14 He will redeem their life from oppression and violence; And precious shall be their blood in His sight. 15 And He shall live: And the gold of Sheba will be given to Him; Prayer also will be made for Him continually, And daily He shall be praised. 16 There will be an abundance of grain in the earth, On the top of the mountains: Its fruit shall wave like Lebanon; And those of the city shall flourish like grass of the earth. 17 His name shall endure forever; His name shall continue as long as the sun. And men shall be blessed in Him; All nations shall call Him blessed.

Justice ... provision ... abundance.

You can think of a lot of scriptures about how wonderful the Millennium will be ... "Utopia".

Certainly for us ... as firstfruits ... glorified and immortal.

Today I want to look more closely at the lives of those people who will live on into the Millennium ... and those born then.

It will be a very different world. No ghettoes ... no military camps or academies ... no corrupt governments ... no x-rated media ... tv ... no drug problems ... no sink estates ... no unemployment. The truth available everywhere.

So ... is it perfect Utopia? Does every person live a perfectly holy ... righteous life? What will it be like ... in reality ... at street level?

Up until a few years ago ... I thought it would be perfectly perfect. I couldn't understand how anyone would not rejoice and choose to live right in such a perfect environment.

Well ... the good news is: it will be almost perfect. But not 100%.

First of all and important to remember: These people ... hundreds of millions ... are ordinary human beings. Flesh and blood. They will still have free will ... they will still have to make choices.

It has always been that way ... and it always will be.

In the Garden of Eden ... Adam and Eve. Before the "fall". They had a simple test: choose to hear and obey.

Choice ... free choice ... is fundamental.

Deuteronomy 30:15-20 (NKJV)

15 "See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil,
 16 in that I command you today to love the Lord your God, to
 walk in His ways, and to keep His commandments, His

statutes, and His judgments, that you may live and multiply; and the Lord your God will bless you in the land which you go to possess. 17 But if your heart turns away so that you do not hear, and are drawn away, and worship other gods and serve them,

18 I announce to you today that you shall surely perish; you shall not prolong your days in the land which you cross over the Jordan to go in and possess.

19 <mark>I call heaven and earth as witnesses today against you, that I</mark> have set before you life and death<mark>, blessing and cursing; therefore</mark> choose life, that both you and your descendants may live; 20 that you may love the Lord your God, that you may obey His voice, and that you may cling to Him, for He is your life and the length of your days; and that you may dwell in the land which the Lord swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to give them."

God won't choose for us. He'll instruct ... teach ... correct ... reprove ... may punish. But ... He won't remove our freedom to choose. He doesn't want automated robots. He wants sons and daughters which choose His ways.

It will be much easier in the World Tomorrow. A fantastic environment ... truth ... Jesus ... Moses ... Abraham. No satan ... no false churches. Vastly easier ... but it will still require a choice.

<mark>Jeremiah 17:7-10 (NKJV)</mark>

7 "<mark>Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord.</mark> <mark>And whose hope is the Lord</mark>.

8 For he shall be like a tree planted by the waters, Which spreads out its roots by the river, And will not fear when heat comes;
But its leaf will be green, And will not be anxious in the year of drought, Nor will cease from yielding fruit.
9 "The heart is deceitful above all things.
And desperately wicked;
Who can know it?
10 I, the Lord, search the heart.
I test the mind. (probe)
Even to give every man according to his ways.
According to the fruit of his doings.

The heart is deceitful. God probes ... tests ... examines. In the World Tomorrow ... it still applies. What is in the heart of people then?

Maybe on the outside they look good ... righteous. They present an image of a dedicated follower ... but ... what's really in their heart?

<u>1 Chronicles 29:10-12 (NKJV)</u>

10 Therefore David blessed the Lord before all the assembly; and David said: ⁴<u>Blessed are You, Lord God of Israel, our Father, forever and ever.</u>
<u>11 Yours, O Lord, is the greatness,</u>
<u>The power and the glory,</u>
<u>The victory and the majesty;</u>
<u>For all that is in heaven and in earth is Yours;</u>
<u>Yours is the kingdom, O Lord,</u>
<u>And You are exalted as head over all.</u>
<u>12 Both riches and honour come from You,</u>
<u>And You reign over all.</u>
<u>In Your hand is power and might;</u>
<u>In Your hand it is to make great</u>
<u>And to give strength to all.</u>

<mark>1 Chronicles 29:16-19 (NKJV</mark>)

16 "O Lord our God, all this abundance that we have prepared to build You a house for Your holy name is from Your hand, and is all Your own.
17 I know also, my God, that You test the heart and have pleasure in uprightness. As for me, in the uprightness of my heart I have willingly offered all these things; and now with joy I have seen Your people, who are present here to offer willingly to You.

18 O Lord God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, our fathers, keep this forever in the intent of the thoughts of the heart of Your people, and fix their heart toward You.

19 And give my son Solomon a loyal heart to keep Your commandments and Your testimonies and Your statutes, to do all these things, and to build the temple for which I have made provision."

God wants to see. People may talk the talk ... especially when all is well. But ... how deep ... real ... what response in adversity? What's in the heart?

We saw in our first scripture "many shall come and say ...". It doesn't say "everyone" ... or "all". It is not clear ... but might be indicative?

Revelation 12:5 (NKJV)

5 <mark>She bore a male Child who was to rule all nations with a rod of</mark> <mark>iron. And her Child was caught up to God and His throne</mark>. Jesus is to rule all nations with a rod of iron. He doesn't rule ... or reign ... till after the Millennium starts.

Revelation 19:11-16 (NKJV)

11 Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war

12 His eyes were like a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns. He had a name written that no one knew except Himself.

13 He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and <u>His name is called</u> The Word of God.

14 And the armies in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, followed Him on white horses.

15 Now out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should strike the nations. And He Himself will rule them with a rod of iron. He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God.

16 And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS.

Why would you need a rod of iron if everyone was perfect ... yielded ... submissive ... teachable?

Revelation 2:25-29 (NKJV) (To the Church in Thyatira) 25 But hold fast what you have till I come.

26 And he who overcomes, and keeps My works until the end, to him I will give power over the nations—

27 "He shall rule them with a rod of iron;

They shall be dashed to pieces like the potter's vessels'—as I also have received from My Father;

28 and I will give him the morning star.

29 "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches." '

Revelation 2:27 (NET)

27 <u>he will rule them with an iron rod</u> and like clay jars he will break them to pieces, (it does appear there will be resistance ... people will still have free choice) Consider the parable about the Faithful Servant ... HAVE AUTHORITY over 5 cities ... 10 cities.

The only need to wield such authority is to overcome resistance. Even though satan is gone ... our world's values (today) are receding into history by then.

People in the Millennium are still flesh ... with its natural desires ... likes ... selfishness ... self-centredness.

<u>Romans 7:18-25 (NKJV)</u>

18 <mark>For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells;</mark> for to will is present with me, but how to perform what is good I do not find.

19 <mark>For the good that I will to do, I do not do; but the evil I will not to do, that I practice</mark>.

20 Now if I do what I will not to do, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me.

21 I find then a law, that evil is present with me, the one who wills to do good.

22 For I delight in the law of God according to the inward man.

23 But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members.

24 O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?

25 I thank God-through Jesus Christ our Lord!

<u>So then, with the mind I myself serve the law of God, but with the flesh the law of sin</u>.

<u>Romans 8:5-10 (NKJV)</u>

5 For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit.

6 For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.

7 <mark>Because the carnal mind is enmity against God; for it is not subject</mark> <u>to the law of God, nor indeed can be</u>.

8 So then, those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

9 <mark>But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His</mark>

10 And if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit is life because of righteousness.

In the absence of satan ... worldly tv and movies ... selfish examples ... dishonest advertising ... when people have access to the truth ... fleshly minds will be much less of a problem than today. But still there ... to be controlled ... right decisions made ... poor ones avoided.

<u>lsaiah 30:18-31 (NKJV)</u>

18 Therefore the Lord will wait, *(for your repentance)* that He may be gracious to you; And therefore He will be exalted, that He may have mercy on you. For the Lord is a God of justice: Blessed are all those who wait for Him. 19 For the people shall dwell in Zion at Jerusalem: You shall weep no more. He will be very gracious to you at the sound of your cry; When He hears it, He will answer you. 20 And though the Lord gives you The bread of adversity and the water of affliction, Yet your teachers will not be moved into a corner anymore, But your eyes shall see your teachers. (Teachers ... us?) 21 Your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, "This is the way, walk in it," (Some say an invisible being whispering . Don Roth:Conscience?) Whenever you turn to the right hand Or whenever you turn to the left.

So ... people will be tempted to go off the path. But ... it doesn't say that they'll always heed the Word! (Anymore than we do today ... whether it's our conscience ... or a minister ... or something we read in the Word)

<mark>Zechariah 14:1-4 (NKJV)</mark>

1 Behold, the day of the Lord is coming,

And your spoil will be divided in your midst.

2 For I will gather all the nations to battle against Jerusalem;

The city shall be taken,

The houses rifled, And the women ravished. Half of the city shall go into captivity, But the remnant of the people shall not be cut off from the city. 3 Then the Lord will go forth And fight against those nations, As He fights in the day of battle. 4 <u>And in that day His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives</u>, Which faces Jerusalem on the east. And the Mount of Olives shall be split in two, From east to west, Making a very large valley; Half of the mountain shall move toward the north And half of it toward the south.

<mark>Zechariah 14:9 (NKJV)</mark>

9 And the Lord shall be King over all the earth.

<u>In that day it shall be—</u>

<u>"The Lord is one,"</u>

<mark>And His name one</mark>.

<mark>Zechariah 14:16-19 (NKJV)</mark>

16 <mark>And it shall come to pass that everyone who is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall go up from year to year to year to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, and to keep the Feast of Tabernacles.</mark>

17 And it shall be that whichever of the families of the earth do not come up to Jerusalem to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, on them there will be no rain. (Not prepared to come up to Jerusalem ...

because they have free choice ... they are not robots)

18 <u>If the family of Egypt will not come up and enter in, they shall</u> have no rain; they shall receive the plague with which the Lord strikes the nations who do not come up to keep the Feast of Tabernacles

19 <mark>This shall be the punishment of Egypt and </mark>the punishment of all the nations that do not come up to keep the Feast of <mark>Tabernacles</mark>.

<mark>Zechariah 14:17 (NET</mark>)

17 <mark>But if any of the nations anywhere on earth refuse to go up to</mark> Jerusalem to worship the King, the Lord who rules over all, they will get no rain. (Some will refuse not to go. There is still resistance)

They refuse! Despite invitation ... instruction. Probably resentment ... disobedience ... and worst in the beginning.

Ezekiel 36:26-30 (NKJV)

26 I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh.

27 <mark>I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them. 28 Then you shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers; you shall be My people, and I will be your God.</mark>

29 I will deliver you from all your uncleannesses. I will call for the grain and multiply it, and bring no famine upon you.

30 And I will multiply the fruit of your trees and the increase of your fields, so that you need never again bear the reproach of famine among the nations.

Ezekiel 37:21-22 (NKJV)

21 "Then say to them, "Thus says the Lord God: 'Surely I will take the children of Israel from among the nations, wherever they have gone, and will gather them from every side and bring them into their own land:

22 and <mark>I will make them one nation in the land</mark>, on the mountains of Israel; and one king shall be king over them all; they shall no longer be two nations, nor shall they ever be divided into two kingdoms again.

<u>Ezekiel 37:24-28 (NKJV)</u>

24 "**David My servant shall be king over them**, and they shall all have one shepherd; they shall also walk in My judgments and observe My statutes, and do them.

25 Then they shall dwell in the land that I have given to Jacob My servant, where your fathers dwelt; and they shall dwell there, they, their children, and their children's children, forever; and My servant David shall be their prince forever.

26 Moreover I will make a covenant of peace with them, and it shall be an everlasting covenant with them; I will establish them and

<u>multiply them, and I will set My sanctuary in their midst</u> <u>forevermore</u>.

27 <mark>My tabernacle also shall be with them; indeed I will be their God,</mark> <mark>and they shall be My people</mark>.

28 The nations also will know that I, the Lord, sanctify Israel, when My sanctuary is in their midst forevermore." ' "

So. The timing is now the Millennium . It seems that a number of years have passed ... 10/20/50??

<u>Ezekiel 38:1-12 (NKJV)</u>

1 Now the word of the Lord came to me, saying,

2 "Son of man, set your face against Gog, of the land of Magog, the prince of Rosh, Meshech, and Tubal, and prophesy against him, 3 and say, "Thus says the Lord God: 'Behold, I am against you, O Gog, the prince of Rosh, Meshech, and Tubal.

4 I will turn you around, put hooks into your jaws, and lead you out, with all your army, horses, and horsemen, all splendidly clothed, a great company with bucklers and shields, all of them handling swords.

5 Persia, Ethiopia, and Libya are with them, all of them with shield and helmet;

6 Gomer and all its troops; the house of Togarmah from the far north and all its troops—many people are with you.

7 "Prepare yourself and be ready, you and all your companies that are gathered about you; and be a guard for them.

8 After many days you will be visited. In the latter years you will come into the land of those brought back from the sword and gathered from many people on the mountains of Israel, which had long been desolate; they were brought out of the nations, and now all of them dwell safely. 9 You will ascend, coming like a storm, covering the land like a cloud, you and all your troops and many peoples with you."

10 "Thus says the Lord God: 'On that day it shall come to pass that thoughts will arise in your mind, and you will make an evil plan: 11 You will say, "I will go up against a land of unwalled villages; I will go to a peaceful people, who dwell safely, all of them dwelling

without walls, and having neither bars nor gates'—

<u>12 to take plunder and to take booty, to stretch out your hand against the waste places that are again inhabited, and against a people gathered from the nations, who have acquired livestock and goods, who dwell in the midst of the land.</u>

Lots of jealous ... resentful nations.

<u>Ezekiel 38:14-23 (NKJV)</u>

14 "Therefore, son of man, prophesy and say to Gog, "Thus says the Lord God: "On that day when My people Israel dwell safely, will you not know it?

15 Then you will come from your place out of the far north, you and many peoples with you, all of them riding on horses, a great company and a mighty army.

16 You will come up against My people Israel like a cloud, to cover the land. It will be in the latter days that I will bring you against My land, so that the nations may know Me, when I am hallowed in you, O Gog, before their eyes." 1

7 Thus says the Lord God: "Are you he of whom I have spoken in former days by My servants the prophets of Israel, who prophesied for years in those days that I would bring you against them?

Judgment on Gog

18 "<mark>And it will come to pass at the same time, <mark>when Gog comes</mark> <mark>against the land of Israel</mark>," says the Lord God, "*that My fury will* show in My face.</mark>

19 <mark>For in My jealousy and in the fire of My wrath I have spoken:</mark> <u>
'Surely in that day there shall be a great earthquake in the land of</u>
<u>
Israel</u>,

20 so that the fish of the sea, the birds of the heavens, the beasts of the field, all creeping things that creep on the earth, and all men who are on the face of the earth shall shake at My presence. The mountains shall be thrown down, the steep places shall fall, and every wall shall fall to the ground.'

21 <u>I will call for a sword against Gog throughout all My mountains</u>," says the Lord God. "Every man's sword will be against his brother.

22 <mark>And I will bring him to judgment with pestilence and bloodshed; I will rain down on him, on his troops, and on the many peoples who are with him, flooding rain, great hailstones, fire, and brimstone.</mark>

23 Thus I will magnify Myself and sanctify Myself, and I will be known in the eyes of many nations. Then they shall know that I am the Lord." '

God's fury ... destruction.

<u>Ezekiel 39:1 (NKJV)</u>

1 "And you, son of man, prophesy against Gog, and say, 'Thus says the Lord God: "Behold, I am against you, O Gog, the prince of Rosh, Meshech, and Tubal;

<u>Ezekiel 39:4-12 (NKJV)</u>

4 You shall fall upon the mountains of Israel, you and all your troops and the peoples who are with you; I will give you to birds of prey of every sort and to the beasts of the field to be devoured.

5 You shall fall on the open field; for I have spoken," says the Lord God. 6 "And I will send fire on Magog and on those who live in security in the coastlands. Then they shall know that I am the Lord.

7 So I will make My holy name known in the midst of My people Israel, and I will not let them profane My holy name anymore. Then the nations shall know that I am the Lord, the Holy One in Israel.

8 Surely it is coming, and it shall be done," says the Lord God. "This is the day of which I have spoken.

9 "<mark>Then those who dwell in the cities of Israel will go out and set on fire and burn the weapons, both the shields and bucklers, the bows and arrows, the javelins and spears; and they will make fires with them for seven years.</mark>

10 They will not take wood from the field nor cut down any from the forests, because they will make fires with the weapons; and they will plunder those who plundered them, and pillage those who pillaged them," says the Lord God.

11 "It will come to pass in that day that I will give Gog a burial place there in Israel, the valley of those who pass by east of the sea; and it will obstruct travellers, because there they will bury Gog and all his multitude. Therefore they will call it the Valley of Hamon Gog

12 For seven months the house of Israel will be burying them, in order to cleanse the land.

Ezekiel 39:21 (NKJV)

21 "<mark>I will set My glory among the nations; all the nations shall see My</mark> judgment which I have executed, and My hand which I have laid on <u>them</u>.

The point here is that even some decades later ... and with no satan ... and truth available ... and Jesus on earth as King ... many nations will

refuse to heed. Carnality ... envy ... jealousy ... traditional hatreds still there ... playing on their sinful human nature.

It looks like this is probably the last battle of the early Millennium. No armies left. A much greater awareness of King Jesus.

For hundreds more years ... the truth will radiate from Jerusalem ... world peace ... prosperity ... health ... happiness ... for all who desire it (hopefully ... the vast majority).

It may be ... ultimately ... that the whole world looks converted ... keeping the Sabbaths ... Holy Days ... God's ways ... honouring God ... thankful ... on their way to eternal life ... resisting their natural selfishness ...making right choices.

But ... even if that is what it looks like ... there are still unconverted hearts.

Revelation 20:1-6 (NKJV)

1 <u>Then I saw an angel coming down from heaven, having the key to</u> <u>the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand</u>.

2 <mark>He laid hold of the dragon, that serpent of old, who is the Devil and</mark> <mark>Satan, and bound him for a thousand years</mark>;

3 and he cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal on him, so that he should deceive the nations no more till the thousand years were finished. But after these things he must be released for a little while.

4 And I saw thrones, and they sat on them, and judgment was committed to them. Then I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded for their witness to Jesus and for the word of God, who had not worshiped the beast or his image, and had not received his mark on their foreheads or on their hands. And they lived and reigned with Christ for a thousand years.

5 <mark>But the rest of the dead did not live again until the thousand years</mark> were finished. This is the first resurrection.

6 Blessed and holy is he who has part in the first resurrection. Over such the second death has no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years. Now to the end of 1,000 years of God's ways ... truth ... reign of the saints. Satan released ... then what?

Revelation 20:7-9 (NKJV)

7 Now when the thousand years have expired, Satan will be released from his prison
8 and will go out to deceive the nations which are in the four corners of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle, whose number is as the sand of the sea. (NET ... "They are as numerous as the grains of sand in the sea".)
9 They went up on the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints and the beloved city. And fire came down from God out of heaven and devoured them.

Satan goes to deceive. Does he have any success? 1,000 years of truth after all!! Maybe a few? (NET) "They are as numerous as the grains

of sand in the sea". Millions? Who lived in the Millennium!!

These aren't completely innocent ... pure-in-heart ... that satan has cunningly deceived against their will. God's not playing a game ... forfeit eternal life by minor mistake.

These people are those who've never really accepted God's ways. Their selfish nature has always resented the ways of God. Perhaps they've resented being ruled by immortal saints? Perhaps they resent that they were not among the firstfruits ... or not part of the Bride of Christ? Or just don't like God's laws and principles.

Either way ... their hearts have always been hostile ... resentful ... selfish. They may have concealed it well ... but now a big opportunity to get behind this glorious spirit being ... this angel of light ... with his promises of victory and glory ... his way. And ... they fall for it!

You can really only be deceived if you don't value and love the truth.

<u>2 Thessalonians 2:8-12 (NKJV)</u>

8 <mark>And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the Lord will consume with the breath of His mouth and destroy with the brightness of His coming.</mark> 9 The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders,
10 and with all unrighteous deception among those who perish,
because they did not receive the love of the truth, that they
might be saved.
11 And for this reason God will send them strong delusion, that they

12 that they all may be condemned who did not believe the truth but had pleasure in unrighteousness.

People have to co-operate to be deceived.

So ... when satan is released ... it's a test of the hearts of those in the Millennium. Are they really converted? Passive at best ... hostile at worst.

This will be the state of at least a percentage of people throughout the Millennium.

Satan's release will identify them. So they can be removed. Then all who are living will be those going God's way wholeheartedly.

Then the rest of the dead are raised to physical life ... probably for 100 years.

Thankfully ... the final generation from the Millennium ... when they meet and greet those in the second resurrection ... will have been cleansed.

So those now resurrected will have no satan to contend with (already experienced that!) ... but also ... no "Millennials" who harbour resentment and hostility to God to mix with them and seek to stir up their former passions and desires.

Hopefully ... many will ... probably a number won't. They will look back with fondness on the "fleshpots of Egypt ... the cucumbers" of their old lives. They won't change.

We will talk about that on the Last Great Day.

So ... the World Tomorrow will be wonderful ... for most ... joyous ... seem like Utopia ... health ... prosperity ... productive lives ... knowing God and the truth.

But it won't be perfect ... not yet. There is still an undercurrent of selfishness ... resentment towards God ... stubbornness ... self-will. Almost perfection... but not just yet.

But once the Millennium is over and Great White Throne Judgment ... then.

Revelation 21:1-8 (NKJV)

1 Now I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. Also there was no more sea.

2 Then I, John, saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.

3 And I heard a loud voice from heaven saying, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be

His people. God Himself will be with them and be their God. 4 And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away."

5 <mark>Then He who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." And He said to me, "Write, for these words are true and faithful</mark>."

6 <mark>And He said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. I will give of the fountain of the water of life freely to him who thirsts.</mark>

<mark>7 He who overcomes shall inherit all things, and I will be his God and</mark> <u>he shall be My son</u>.

8 <u>But the cowardly, unbelieving, abominable, murderers, sexually</u> <u>immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars shall have their part in the</u> <u>lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second</u> <u>death</u>."

That's perfection. Everyone ... everything ... is Holy ... Righteous ... Eternal ... Glorious.

So ... let's look forward to the World Tomorrow ... a huge leap forward ... especially the firstfruits ... but the real prize ... PERFECT PEACE ... awaits the NEW HEAVENS AND THE NEW EARTH!
